Responding to an incident: Procedure for treatment for injuries: Minor will be treated on site with the assistance of Team Managers and/or Memorial Pools Staff. In the unlikely event of a serious injury, the Memorial Pools Health and Safety Officer or other suitably qualified person will assess the patient, call an Ambulance, keep the patient calm and reassured, treat any symptoms, and continually monitor until help arrives. An incident form will be completed after the event and the incident investigated with a report given to their manager. Staff must read and attach a copy of the relevant response plan for identified incidents.
