**Programme** There will be a Managers meeting at 8:45am in the stadium on Court 1.

A representative from each school MUST be present.

**Start time** The tournament will begin at 9:00am and will conclude at 2:30pm.

**Eligibility** Junior teams - Years 9 and 10 only

**Grades** Junior Boys

### **Entries**

- \$20 per team schools will be invoiced after entries close
- Each school can enter a maximum of 2 boys teams and 2 girls teams
- Entries must be submitted by email to wlivingstone@tacol.nz by Friday 13 November 4pm
- Teams withdrawn after the entry closing date will still be liable for the entry fee
- Each team needs to provide a referee. If a team can't provide a referee they can pay \$30 to Te
  Aroha College in cash on the day and a referee will be provided.
- Schools must email <u>wlivingstone@tacol.nz</u> by Friday 13 November indicating how many referees they need Te Aroha College to provide.

### **Team Registration**

A minimum of 4 players must be registered per team

### **Team Management**

All teams must have a teacher or adult in charge of them for the entirety of each game. If a team does not have supervision they will lose by default. This person is to complete the scoresheet before and after the game where needed, implement the rules of the competition and supervise the players.

When not playing teams will be required to score other games.

### First Aid

Each team is responsible for their own First Aid supplies. The coach/manager should be aware of any special medical conditions of a player. It is preferable if an adult attending the tournament with the team is First Aid qualified.

No chewing gum, alcohol or smoking

- > Students are to conduct themselves in a considerate manner
- > Students should not be "messing" about in the changing/shower areas and to observe any signage around the stadium
- ➤ No eating inside the stadium. Food can be consumed outside.
- ➤ There will be bags of ice in the freezers for teams to use if required.

### **Managers meeting**

- Please ensure you are familiar with the information and structure of the tournament as sent to you via email.
- It is the schools managements responsibility to check the draw throughout the day.
- 15 minute time slots for each game, this includes changeover time.
- As we are on a strict timeframe and space it will be the responsibility of the schools management to warm up your teams as no warm up time will be allocated.
- Paper scissors rock to determine to who has 1<sup>st</sup> possession— refs to get this underway straight away.

### **Competition Structure**

To be confirmed once entries have been received

#### **Tournament Rules**

- All matches will be played according to the rules of FIBA see attached rules of the game sheet.
- Unlimited substitutions are allowed.

### **Playing Format**

- 10 minute games
- Roll-on, Roll-off will be used to keep matches on schedule
- The team with the highest amount of points at the end of each game wins

### **Points System**

Three for a win, One for a loss

#### Results

- At the end of each game, a Court Controller will collect the scoresheets from each court and will take it to the main tournament desk for recording.
- A Results Board will be on display for teams to view with up to date results right through to the Finals Round.

#### **Uniforms**

- o All players must play in their school's correct recognised playing uniform.
- Playing shirts must be numbered on both the front and the back.

o Playing barefoot is not permitted. Relevant indoor court shoes must be worn.

# **Duty**

If a team is not playing that round please encourage them to score.

### **Referees**

- Each team is to provide a confident or experienced person to referee.
- o Two referees per court is required.
- The most important item you need is a whistle.

# **Disputes Resolution**

In all cases, if your team has a concern or disagreement with the opposition, this should be resolved on a school-to-school basis. The Tournament Director (Laura Wade) can mediate when it comes to small disputes on the day of play. Any necessary correspondence thereafter should be precise, but polite. If a satisfactory result is not achieved between the two parties, the dispute can be directed to Thames Valley Secondary Schools Sport.
