Welcome to the North Island Secondary Schools Equestrian Championship 2023 brought to you by Equestrian Sports New Zealand and the New Zealand Pony Club Association.

Please read the general conditions before you enter. It is each competitor's responsibility to know the rules and conditions of the event. This year we will be holding a session on Tuesday evening to discuss and answer questions relating to the Jumping and Show Hunter rules. You may bring along any equipment for checking.

The event has been timetabled on the basis that students can compete in all disciplines and stay for four days of competition. There is something for riders of all abilities. Gather your school team mates and give CTR a go, this will be a great warm up event before the jumping and dressage competitions get underway on the following days.

Please carefully check the timetable of the events before you make your entries, keeping in mind the welfare of the horse at all times.

Special Conditions

This event is governed by the ESNZ General Regulations and relevant policies and codes and where applicable discipline sport rules and bylaws. All of these can be accessed via the Equestrian Sports New Zealand website <u>www.nzequestrian.org.nz</u>

The Organising Committee may, at their absolute discretion, decline to receive any entry, or return any fee without being required to give any reason or being liable for any compensation.

The Organising Committee in consultation with the President of the Ground Jury and/or Technical Delegate reserve the right: to cancel any class or event, to divide any class, to alter advertised times, to transfer competitors between sections of competition.

All riders must have an adult on the grounds who is responsible for them. This is not the function of the team manager. The ratio of riders to adults in each school team must not exceed 4:1 at any time. It is the responsibility of the school to ensure this is adhered to.

To assist with running the show all schools will be allocated duties. This will roughly equate to 1 full day of duties for every 4 team members. We will attempt to keep this as fair as possible given the variety in team sizes. Please ensure that you have enough adult supporters to attend to these duties as they may not be able to be scheduled around your competition times.

In the unlikely event cancellation should be required an email will be sent to all entrants. This will also be posted on ESNZ Facebook and Instagram.

All classes will be run in draw order.

- Eligibility
- To be eligible to participate in this event you must be a current full, child or introductory member of ESNZ or a current member of NZPCA if not a current member or either organisation, then you must become a casual member for the event and this is payable with your entries.
- Student Eligibility
- A student eligible to compete in National and Island secondary school events must:
- be enrolled as a bona fide (Year 7 or above) student at the school of representation and studying at least 80% of a programme that is part of the timetable provided by the school for at least four weeks immediately prior to the event.
- have a satisfactory attendance record at the school. The final decision will be at the







principal's discretion.

- be under 19 years of age at the first of January in the year of the competition unless specified otherwise for a particular competition.
- The school must be prepared to authenticate a student's birth date. Organising committees may require validation by a birth certificate or passport.
- All teams and individuals participating in National or Island events must be declared at the date prescribed by the sanctioned sporting body.
- <u>This event is also open to year 7 and 8 students to compete individually, however, if event</u> <u>capacity is over subscribed, year 7 and year 8 entries will not be accepted. This will be notified</u> <u>at close of entries.</u>
- Dogs: dogs are permitted onsite but must adhere to National Equestrian Centre rules around which areas and must also be on a lead at ALL times.
- Entries All competitors should enter as individuals, entries via <u>www.evoevents.co.nz</u>
 Please ensure your school and year level are entered in your My Account on EvoEvents.
 A school contact email must be supplied by all entrants to confirm they are endorsed by the school. All riders from the same school are considered to be in that school team.

No composite teams are allowed. If a rider has two horses, then each is treated as a separate combination for point scoring and only one may count for the school points. When schools do not have a team, riders compete as individuals.

Schools with more than 10 competitors will be asked to split their teams evenly.

Dress: School Team uniform for all events.

Riders can compete in a maximum of three classes on any one day. Riders may only compete in one level in Dressage and Jumping. Timetable is such that combination could compete in all disciplines offered.

Riders are limited to competing a maximum of two equines at the event, should numbers permit.

Entries online at EvoEvents and payments made through PoLi. By entering online, you are making an agreement with the Organising Committee and all fees are due. Entries not fully paid at time of entry will not be accepted but will be held until payment is received and then accepted into the event. Late entry fees will apply if payment is received after close of entries.

- Scratchings
- All scratchings are to be notified immediately via EvoEvents.
- Refunds: Riders scratching from the event 48 hours before start of competition (before 8.00am Saturday 26th August 2023) will be entitled to a 100% refund of entry fees, less EvoEvents Online Booking fees, on presentation of a veterinary or medical certificate.

Accommodation/camping is to be completed online with your entry.

NEC Taupō Portacabins are not currently available to competitors.

There are very limited powered sites available which will be allocated on a first come first served basis. Please don't book a rental caravan that needs power without confirmation that you have been allocated a site.

Stables and covered yards will be allocated on a first in, first paid basis. Only those with lease yards at NECs will take preference.







Camping on grounds is not compulsory however students are strongly encouraged to participate in all evening activities.

Scoring

Points are awarded per placing. Each discipline level will have the same amount of points available to add to the team score. As CTR and Arena Eventing only have one class per level, 3x the amount of points will be awarded than that of the other classes (only one round of Arena eventing can be counted towards team scores per rider). For example

Dressage and Jumping- Each class is allocated 35 placings to gain points, 1st is awarded 35 points, 35th is awarded 1 point, 36th is awarded zero points.

CTR and Arena eventing- 1st place is awarded 105 points, 2nd place 102 points, 35th place is awarded 3 points 36th is awarded zero points.

Awards

Individual Awards

 $\mathbf{1}^{st}$ to 6th placing will be awarded in each class/round

1st to 6th placing will be awarded in each level/height

Team Discipline Awards

1st to 3rd in each discipline – Dressage, Arena Eventing, CTR, Jumping & Show Hunter.

Points for placings will be allocated for each class. For Dressage and Jumping that have 3 classes at each level these are added together for each rider to give total points for the level. For CTR and Arena Eventing the class points directly make the total level points. If an individual competes at more than one level in Arena Eventing they are only eligible for the points from the highest level. If you have more than one horse in a team then the highest eligible points will count (e.g. you can't count 2 lots of individual points from one rider).

Top 4 individual level scores from each team will count towards the overall discipline team score.

Championship Team

1st to 6th overall team – cross discipline award.

The scores for each team discipline award will be added together to give the overall team championship score.

Sportsmanship award

The Sportsmanship award will be awarded to one team who display good sportsmanship throughout things such as:

- Supporting their teammates in the warmup or as a cheer squad whilst their teammates are competing
- Helping ring set up before the show starts/during & after
- Helping keep the grounds clean, picking up rubbish or manure
- Helping pick up rails when they fall during the show and with changing jump heights







To help us judge this it is suggested all team member, parents, coaches & support crew where their school colours/uniforms

NB, Only results from years 9-13 students will be eligible for the team discipline awards and overall championship team award.

CTR is a timed event with teams and individuals given start times approximately five minutes apart. Teams will be given an optimum time (eg 90 minutes) to complete the 10km course and should ride the entire course as a team, crossing the finish line together.

Faults are for being too fast (two time faults for every minute or part thereof under), too slow (one time fault for every minute or part there of over) and also taken from heart rates – which are recorded when they cross the finish line and again at the final vet check (not more than 30 minutes after finishing).

Eligibility

Combinations can only ride at one level

- Downgraded horses and ponies are eligible.
- Introductory (Level 0): Horses / ponies may not have more than 30 Level 1 points unless the rider has never earned any grading points in ESNZ Dressage on any horse or pony.
- Preliminary (Level 1): Horses / ponies may not have more than 30 Level 2 points unless the rider has never earned any grading points in ESNZ Dressage on any horse or pony
- Novice (Level 2) Horses / ponies may not have more than 30 Level 3 points unless the rider has never earned any grading points Level 1 or above in ESNZ Dressage on any horse or pony.
- Elementary (Level 3): Open to all horses/ponies/riders

- Combinations can compete in two consecutive levels if they wish, noting they must not exceed the 3 efforts cross discipline per day per horse. Only the highest round per rider can count towards the team score
- Refer to ESNZ Eventing Rules Annex 7 Arena Eventing for rules pertaining to Arena Eventing.
- In the interests of creating a fair competition the Arena Eventing Competition does not allow Cross Country watches to be worn
- Horse and pony classes may be combined at discretion of organisers.
- There will be no changes of level accepted after 4pm Monday 28th August except in extenuating circumstances with the permission of the appropriate official.

- Not required for intro classes, other classes see levies below.
- Jumping Discipline Levies
- \$7 per show in addition to the entry fee
- Pony 80cm-90cm and Pony 90cm-1.00m Unregistered ponies pay an ESNZ Casual fee of \$5.15 and an ESNZ jumping flexi start of \$25. on top of entry fee.
- Horses 90cm-1.00m and 1.00m-1.05m, Unregistered horses pay an ESNZ Casual fee of \$5.15 and an ESNZ jumping flexi start of \$25 on top of entry fee.
- Combinations can only compete in one level
- A single entry into a jumping height is for three rounds of jumping at the same height, the final round of which is Show Hunter. This round will be judged as per ESNZ Show Hunter rules and will include an Equitation Award (not part of the team scoring) 1st 6th.
- Horse and pony classes may be combined at discretion of organisers.
- There will be no changes of level accepted after 4pm Tuesday 29th August except in extenuating circumstances with the permission of the appropriate official.
