Players to be reminded of the importance of safety before the commencement of play. Any players with medical conditions must be known to the event organisers prior to play.		Players give way to all green keepers' machinery. Any player or spectator using a golf cart must carry a full driver's license and drive the vehicle in accordance with the club rules. General etiquette applies to players in regards to safety. This includes: standing behind the player hitting and not in front.	Golf clubs green keepers will ensure course is in best condition; all ground under repair will be marked to ensure players are aware. Any further information needed regarding the course will be provided to event organisers on the day and subsequently relayed to the participants. Player's wear appropriate clothing to minimise risk of injury (covered shoes/ golf shoes, warm clothing, and wet weather gear where applicable).
